

Poster Session Guidelines

A Poster Session is a graphic presentation of an author's research. The authors illustrate their findings by displaying graphs, photos, diagrams, and a small amount of text.

NPHA Presenter Policy:

- Presenters must be individual members of NPHA to present
- Poster presenters must register for the meeting. Please visit the [conference website](#) for information regarding registration.
- All presenters must be registered by the Early Registration Deadline (August 28, 2020).
- Presenters who fail to show up for their scheduled presentations without previously notifying the program planner of cancellation will not be permitted to present papers or posters at any NPHA-sponsored meeting for two years following the "no-show."

General Information

- For this year's virtual format, poster presenters will record a 3-5 minute video overview of their work along with 3-5 PowerPoint slides outlining the content that would typically be included in a traditional printed poster.
- The pre-recorded videos will be available throughout the conference. However, an hour during the conference schedule will be allotted for poster presenters to be online and accessible by chat to interact with and answer questions from attendees.
- Poster presenters will be expected to participate in short training on the technology that will be used for the poster session..
- A copy of the abstract that you submitted will be included in the conference program. You will have the opportunity to make edits to your abstract. You will receive a link notifying you that the system is open for edits.
